One size 220 x 26 cm

VADN

ORGANIC SOFT MERINO (225 m/50 g) 6 x 50 g in 2-6 colors.

Front: Spiritual 1051 + Charming 1029 + Nostalgic 1005 + Confident 1014 - 100 g of each

Back: Spiritual 1051 + Brilliant 1065 + Gracious 1035 100 g of each

GAUGE

23 st x 44 rows / 3.5 mm in garter st

SUGGESTED NEEDLES

Circular needles or jumper needles / 3.5 mm

KONTUR SCARF is a long scarf made of 12 triangles with an integrated I-cord edge. The scarf is long enough to be worn in many different ways. You can play with using only two or maybe many colors - you need a minimum of 6×50 g.

The triangles are created by knitting stitches up one edge of the previous triangle, so you only have to keep track of one color at the time.

Tip: The triangles use 15-25 g each with the indicated gauge, so this can be a good stash buster project.

ABBREVIATIONS

k = knit

p = purl

st(s) = stitch(es)

dec = decrease(s)

k2tog/k3tog = knit 2 stitches together/knit 3 stitches together

ssk = slip, slip, knit. Slip 2 stitches knitwise one by one and knit them together through the back loop

RS= Right side

WS= Wrong side

SS = Selvedge Stitch. Slip the last stitch purlwise with yarn in front. Turn and knit on the next row.


wyf = With the working yarn in front of the work.


wyb = With the working yarn behind the work.

GAUGE SWATCH

For a good result, you need to make a gauge swatch. You might need more yarn to finish if the gauge is off. A difference of a single stitch per 10 cm can easily give a difference of 5-10 cm on the finished garment, and that changes the drape of the fabric.

The gauge describes how many stitches you must have per 10 cm horizontally on the swatch, and how many needles/rounds you must have per 10 cm vertically. If the number of stitches on your sample is too large compared to the pattern, switch to a larger needle. Switch to a smaller needle if the number of stitches is too low. Wash your sample and measure when dry

PATTERN

The first triangle is made by knitting up stitches along an I-cord. Then you knit up stitches to a new I-cord from the cast-on-edge of the first I-cord and keep knitting this new I-cord alongside the triangle. All triangles (with the exception of the last triangle) have one side with an I-cord edge, and one side with selvedge stitches. Knit up the stitches for the next triangle in the back loop of the selvedge sts of the previous triangle. Wait with weaving in the ends until you have finished the scarf, you can then close any gaps that may occur between the corners of the triangles at the same time.

TRIANGLE 1

With COLOR 1 and needles 3,5 mm cast on 3 sts with backwards-loop cast on. Do not turn the work, but slide the stitches back onto the left needle wyb.

k 3, slide sts to left needle wyb.

Repeat * - * to a total of 59 rounds.

Place the 3 sts (I-CORD 1) on a stitch marker or a safety pin without breaking the yarn.

Continue with the same yarn. Knit up 57 sts in the back loop of a row of sts on the I-cord beginning in the stitch 2 rounds below. Turn to work WS.

Knit up 3 sts from the cast-on-edge of the I-cord, which will form a new I-cord edge on the opposite side of the triangle as you continue knitting. Begin knitting up sts from the st facing the RS.

*slide sts to left needle wyb, k3 *. Repeat * - * once more. Knit to the last st, SS, turn [60 sts].

Work 2 rows as follows:

RS: k to the last 5 sts, k2tog, slip 3 sts wyf.

WS: k to last st, SS. [59 sts]

Now decrease on the RS rows as follows:

Row 1 (RS): k 1, ssk, k to the last 3 sts, slip 3 sts wyf.

Row 2: k to last st, SS.

Repeat Row 1 + Row 2 until there are 5 stitches left on the needle and 56 garter st ridges on RS, ssk, break the yarn and pull the yarn end through the stitch.

Place the last 3 I-cord stitches on a stitch marker or safety pin (I-CORD 2).

TRIANGLE 2

With COLOR 2 on RS, knit up 57 sts in the back loop of the selvedge sts of TRIANGLE 1. Turn to work the WS. Slip 1 st wyf, knit all sts, turn to work the RS.

Place the 3 I-cord stitches from I-CORD 1 onto the left needle, as they naturally face you. The stitch facing WS is placed as the last st. [60 sts]

Work 4 rows by repeating:

RS: k to last st, SS.

WS: k to last 3 sts, slip 3 sts wyf.

Now decrease in the right side of the triangle on every 8th row and in the left side on every 4th row as follows:

Row 1 (RS): k to the last 3 sts, k2tog, SS.

Row 2 (WS): K to last 3 sts, slip 3 sts wyf.

Row 3: K to last st, SS.

Row 4: As Row 2

Row 5: k 3, ssk, k to the last 3 sts, k2tog, SS.

Row 6 - 8: As Row 2 - 4

Repeat Row 1-8 until there are 6 sts left and 74 garter st ridges on RS.

Knit the 3 I-cord sts and place them on a stitch marker or safety pin (I-CORD 3).

 $\mbox{K3}{\mbox{tog}},$ break the yarn and pull the yarn end through the last stitch.

TRIANGLE 3

With COLOR 3 on RS, knit up 75 sts in the back loop of the selvedge sts of TRIANGLE 2, turn to work the WS. Place the 3 sts from I-CORD 2 on the left needle, as they naturally face you. The stitch facing RS is placed as the last st. Knit to last st, SS. [78 sts]

Work 2 rows as follows:

RS: k to the last 3 sts, slip 3 sts wyf.

WS: k to the last st, SS.

Now decrease in both sides of the triangle on every 4th row as follows:

Row 1 (RS): k 1, ssk, k to the last 5 sts, k2tog, slip 3 sts wyf.

Row 2: k to last st, SS

Row 3: k to the last 3 sts, slip 3 sts wyf.

Row 4: As Row 2

Repeat Row 1 - 4 until there are 6 sts left and 74 garter st ridges on RS

Now k 1, make a double decrease by k2tog and slip the first st over, break the yarn and pull the yarn end through the stitch. Place the last 3 I-cord stitches on a stitch marker or safety pin (I-CORD 4).

TRIANGLE 4

With COLOR 1 on RS, knit up 75 sts in the back loop of the selvedge sts of TRIANGLE 3, turn to work the WS. Slip 1 st wyf, knit all sts, turn to work the RS.

Place the 3 sts from I-CORD 2 on the left needle, as they naturally face you. The stitch facing WS is placed as the last st. [78 sts]

Work 2 rows as follows:

RS: k to last st. SS.

WS: k to last 3 sts, slip 3 sts wyf.

Now decrease in both sides of the triangle on every 4th row as follows:

Row 1 (RS): k 3, ssk, k to the last 3 sts, k2tog, SS.

Row 2: knit to the last 3 sts, slip 3 sts wyf.

Row 3: k to the last st, SS.

Row 4: As Row 2

Repeat Row 1 - 4 until there are 6 sts left and 74 garter st ridges on RS

Knit the 3 I-cord sts and place them on a stitch marker or safety pin (I-CORD 5). K3tog, break the yarn and pull the yarn end through the last stitch.

TRIANGLE 5

Knit as TRIANGLE 3 with color 2

TRIANGLE 6

Knit as TRIANGLE 4 with color 3

TRIANGLE 7

Knit as TRIANGLE 3 with color 1 **TRIANGLE 8**

Knit as TRIANGLE 4 with color 2 **TRIANGLE 9**

Knit as TRIANGLE 3 with color 3

TRIANGLE 10

Knit as TRIANGLE 4 with color 1

TRIANGLE 11

With COLOR 2 on RS, knit up 75 sts in the back loop of the selvedge sts of TRIANGLE 10, turn to work the WS. Place the 3 sts from I-CORD 2 on the left needle, as they naturally face you. The stitch facing RS is placed as the last st. Knit to the last st, SS. [78 sts]

Knit 4 rows by repeating:

RS: k to last 3 sts, slip 3 sts wyf.

WS: k to the last st, SS.

Now decrease in the right side of the triangle on every 4th row and in the left side on every 2nd row as follows:

Row 1 (RS): k 1, ssk, k to the last 5 sts, k2tog, slip 3 sts wyf.

Row 2: k to last st, SS

Row 3: k to the last 5 sts, k2tog, slip 3 sts wyf.

Row 4: As Row 2

Repeat Row 1 - 4 until there are 6 sts left and 50 garter st ridges on RS

Now k 1, make a double decrease by k2tog and slip the first st over, break the yarn and pull the yarn end through the stitch. Place the last 3 I-cord stitches on a stitch marker or safety pin (I-CORD).

TRIANGLE 12

With COLOR 3 on RS, knit up 51 sts in the back loop of the selvedge sts of TRIANGLE 11, turn to work the WS.

Place the 3 I-cord stitches from TRIANGLE 11 on the left needle, as they naturally face you. The stitch facing RS is placed as the last st. Knit all sts, turn the work to the RS. [54 sts]

Place the 3 I-cord stitches from TRIANGLE 10 on the left needle, as they naturally face you. The stitch facing WS is placed as the last st [57 sts]

Work 2 rows by repeating:

Both RS and WS: k to last 3 sts, slip 3 sts wyf.

On this last triangle you knit I-cord edges in both sides while decreasing on every 4th row in the right side and every 2nd row in the left side as follows:

Row 1 (RS): k 3, ssk, k to the last 5 sts, k2tog, slip 3 sts wyf.

Row 2: k to the last 3 sts, slip 3 sts wyf.

Row 3: K to the last 5 sts, k2tog, slip 3 sts wyf.

Row 4: As Row 2

Repeat Row 1-4 until there are 9 sts left and 33 garter st ridges on RS

Finish:

RS: k 3, k3tog, slip 3 sts wyf, turn.

WS: k 2, k2tog.

Now you have 3 stitches on both your right and left needle. With a long yarn end, graft the I-cord stitches on the right and left needle together to form the last tip of the scarf.

FINISHING

Unlike a sweater, a scarf is often seen from both sides. You can hide your ends by weaving in the ends in the I-cord edge wherever the color matches. The other ends you can split in two and weave them in separately by mimicking the stitches. Wash and stretch your scarf to fit the measurements or block it with needles and leave to dry lying flat.
